“ I can lick any son-of-a-bitch in the world. ” So boasted John L. Sullivan, the first modern heavyweight boxing champion of the world, a man who was the gold standard of American sport for more than a decade, and the first athlete to earn more than a million dollars. He had a big ego, big mouth, and bigger appetites. His womanizing, drunken escapades, and chronic police-blotter presence were godsend to a burgeoning newspaper industry. The larger-than-life boxer embodied the American Dream for late nineteenth-century immigrants as he rose from Boston ’ s Irish working class to become the most recognizable man in the nation. In the process, the “ Boston Strong Boy ” transformed boxing from outlawed bare-knuckle fighting into the gloved spectacle we know today. Strong Boy tells the story of America ’ s first sports superstar, a self-made man who personified the power and excesses of the Gilded Age. Everywhere John L. Sullivan went, his fists backed up his bravado. Sullivan ’ s epic brawls, such as his 75-round bout against Jake Kilrain, and his cross-country barnstorming tour in which he literally challenged all of America to a fight are recounted in vivid detail, as are his battles outside the ring with a troubled marriage, wild weight and fitness fluctuations, and raging alcoholism. Strong Boy gives readers ringside seats to the colorful tale of one of the country ’ s first Irish-American heroes and the birth of the American sports media and the country ’ s celebrity obsession with athletes.

A knockout biography of John L. Sullivan that puts the fabled boxing champ squarely in the context of his rough-and-tumble times. Drawing on a wealth of contemporary sources, including the scandalous National Police Gazette, Isenberg (History/Annapolis) recounts how Sullivan brawled his way from a working-class background in Boston's Irish ghetto to the top of the prizefighting world.

Essentially the last of the bare-knuckle heavyweight champions, John L. Sullivan was instrumental in the acceptance of gloved fighting. His charisma and popular appeal during this transitional period contributed greatly to making boxing a nationally popular, “ legitimate ” sport. Sullivan became boxing ’ s first superstar and arguably the first of any sport. From his first match in the late 1870s through his final championship fight in 1892, this biography contains a thoroughly researched, detailed accounting of John L. Sullivan ’ s boxing career. With special attention to the 1880s, the decade during which Sullivan came to prominence, it follows Sullivan ’ s skill development and discusses his opponents and fights in detail, providing various viewpoints of a single event. Beginning with a discussion of early boxing practices, the sport itself is placed within sociological, legal and historical contexts including anti – prize fighting laws and the so-called “ color line. ” A complete record of Sullivan ’ s career is also included.

From the olden days of cudgel fighting and unbelievable bravery in battle, to man-on-man with fists or gloves, Ireland is renowned for its "Fighting Irish". Even before the introduction of the Marquis of Queensbury Rules, Ireland enjoyed a rich heritage of boxing success. Fabled fighters such as Simon Byrne, Dan Donnelly, Yankee Sullivan, Paddy Ryan, John Morrissey, Peter Corcoran, Joe Coburn and Ned O' Baldwin (plus many more) won fame in Britain and the United States in the pre-gloved era. Irish-Americans dominated the heavyweight division at the start of the gloved period. John L Sullivan and James J Corbett were the first two champions, followed by Bob Fitzsimmons, who also had Irish heritage. The top contenders also had Irish blood coursing through their veins - Charlie Mitchell, Ed Smith, Jake Kilrain, Frank Slavin and others - but there were also Irish-born fighters of the top-rank, Jack Burke, Mike Cleary, Peter Maher, Tom Sharkey, George Gardner and later on, Jim Coffey and Bartley Madden. This well-researched book recounts their stories and those of other notable Irish heavyweights who made their mark pre-1925, and charts the fascinating history of Irish heavyweight boxers. Divided into two books, part one deals with the top heavyweights from the death of bare-knuckle fighting around 1880 up until 1925. Packed with compelling historical details from reliable primary sources this credible read eliminates bias and inaccuracies that have occurred over time. There is a balance of fighters included, some relatively famous (Maher, Sharkey, Coffey, McTigue and Gardner) and great fighters who were never before properly documented (Cyclone Warren, Jack Burke, Mike Cleary, Pakey Mahony, Bartley Madden and Jem Roche). Then there are the forgotten scrappers - Jim Scanlon, Denis Hough, WW1 war hero Dan Voyles, Gunner Rawles, crazy "Nutty" Curran, Olympic champion Con O'Kelly and South African champion, Mike Williams from Galway. The stories of these men, their battles, triumphs, trials, tribulations and indeed their lives, are gathered together as never before and explored between the covers of this memorable book that's a must-have for all serious boxing enthusiasts.
